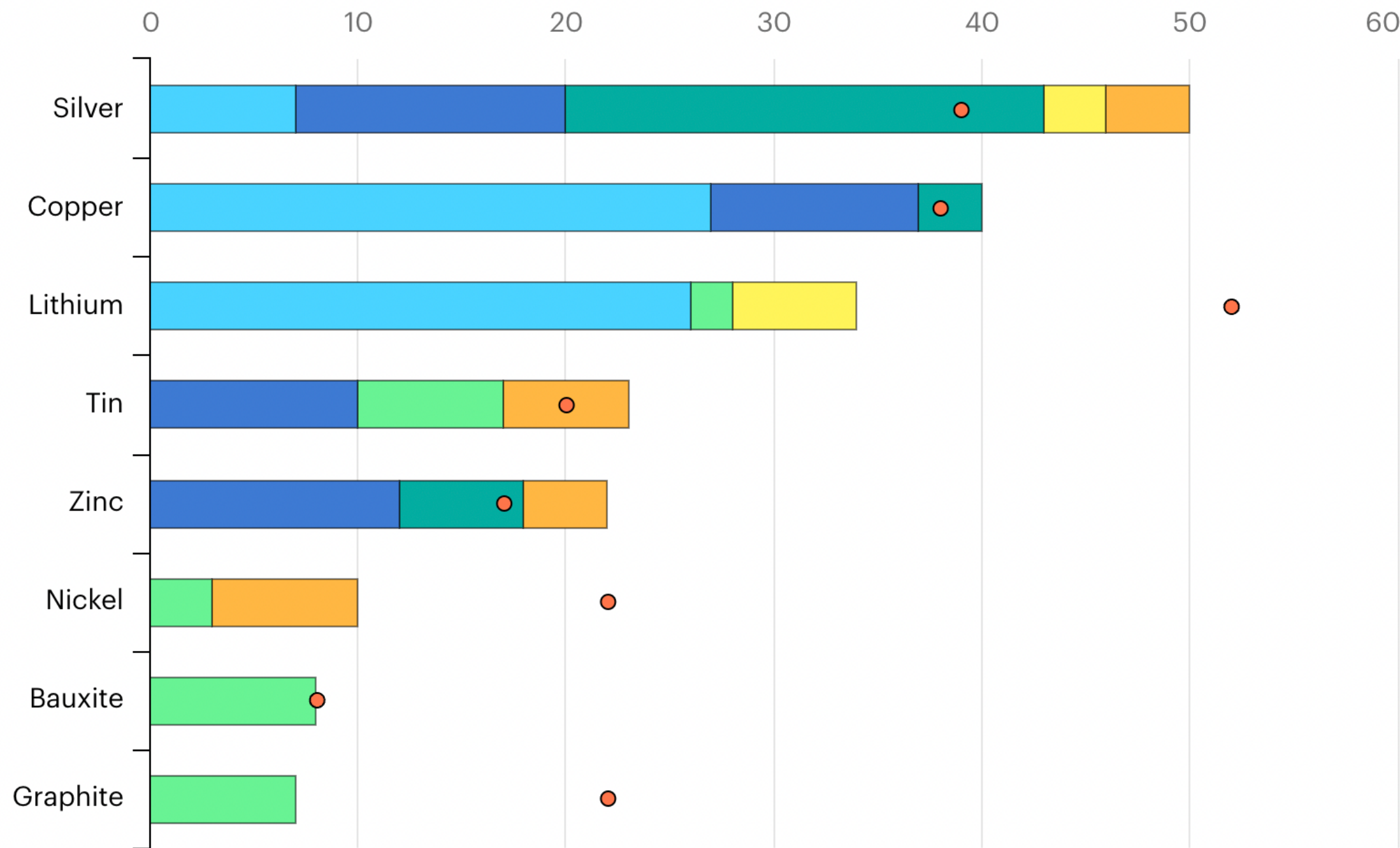
Critical Mineral Concentrations



Latin America's opportunity in critical minerals for the clean energy transition

Latin America is a major producer of critical minerals for clean energy transitions, with considerable potential to expand its role

Latin America could expand into a range of other materials such as rare earth elements that are required for electric vehicle motors and wind turbines, and nickel, a key component in batteries.

The region's lithium – predominantly lithium carbonate from brine – produces fewer emissions than mining from rock and could benefit from the growing adoption of lithium iron phosphate batteries. Latin America could therefore have an even more important role to play in meeting rapidly rising global demand for lithium.

Information alone will not be sufficient to trigger the investment needed to exploit fully these resources. Gov'ts need to establish frameworks to attract increased investments in mining and processing activities, setting clear regulations and creating incentives... Dialogue with stakeholders, investors, as well as an increase in international cooperation will be crucial for both the design and the implementation of these frameworks.
